



Conclusion

- 95% of people who believed climate change is having an obvious affect on our local community also believed that climate change is happening around the world. The other 5% was unsure if it was really happening in the entire world but they believed that climate change was happening within our local community.
- 77% of people who didn't believe that climate change was affecting our local community thought that climate change was happening in the real world.
- 93% of people with a high school education believed that climate change was really happening in the world. The other 7% said that climate change wasn't happening.
- 8% of people with a masters degree were not sure if climate change was happening. The other 92% thought that climate change was definitely happening.
- 6% of people with 0-5 years of snow sports experience believed that climate change isn't happening. The remainder agree.
- 97% of people with 20+ years in snow sports experience believed that climate change is happening. The remainder are unsure.
